## The History of Knipperfrotjes

Every one of my friends will receive a Knipperfrotje as a gift, at some point in their life.

Unless you ask for one: in that case, you'll definitely never get one!

I made the very first Knipperfrotje in 1986, as evidenced by a hand-drawn electrical diagram.

By popular demand, and because I also want to give strangers the joy of their own Knipperfrotje, I started selling them through my webshop. And every now and then, I even give workshops where people – under my very strict supervision, of course – can make their own Knipperfrotje.

## The official Knipperfrotjes rules (three)

These rules apply immediately and inexorably from the moment you acquire a Knipperfrotje – regardless of how this happened (except in the case of theft).

### 1. Location

You can experiment for one to a maximum of two days to determine the best location in your home. After that, the Knipperfrotje may only be moved very limitedly due to Rule 2.

### 2. Leave it on (the main rule!)

After the best spot in your house has been determined, the Knipperfrotje must be turned on immediately: it must NEVER be turned off, except briefly when moving to another house.

If I, Eibert Draisma, come to visit and the Knipperfrotje turns out to be unplugged, I'll immediately confiscate it – and you'll NEVER get it back! Very unfortunately, that really happened once.

### 3. Warranty Conditions

Everything, absolutely everything that could possibly happen to a Knipperfrotje is covered by the warranty, except for theft. Treat a Knipperfrotje as you would your loved ones: with tenderness.

This warranty is, of course, valid for life, meaning as long as I (Eibert Draisma) am alive.
